piece *noun* a **piece** of music is a short part of a longer musical concert

pill *noun* a kind of tablet which has medicine or vitamins inside

planets *noun* the large round objects that go around the sun. Earth is one of the **planets**.

plate (of salad) *noun* something which you put your food on and eat from

play a trick on *verb* to play a joke on someone to make them laugh. Sometimes, tricks can make people angry.

player *noun* a person who plays a sport

popular *adj* If something is **popular**, a lot of people like it.

pour *verb* to let liquid fall from one container into another, for example, from a bottle into a cup

power *verb* to make a car or a machine work

prepare *verb* to get ready now so that you will have what you need in the future

printer *noun* you put paper in this to print things from a computer

programme *noun* a small book of information about a concert or a sports match

pull *verb* to use your hands to hold something and make it come to you

puppet *noun* a model of a person or an animal that you move by using your hands or sticks

queue *noun* a line of people waiting for something

R

racket *noun* a thing which you use for hitting the ball in tennis

radio *noun* an electrical box which you switch on to listen to programmes

rainforest *noun* trees and plants which grow in hot countries where there is a lot of rain

raise money *verb* help to make money, usually to help people

read a map *verb* (*pt*, *pp* read) to use a map to find out how to get to somewhere you don't know

receptionist *noun* a person whose job is to help people who arrive in an office or a hotel

recorder *noun* a musical instrument that you play with your mouth with holes for your fingers

relatives *noun* people who all belong in the same family

remote control *noun* a thing which you hold in your hand and use to change TV channels

repair *verb* When you **repair** something which is broken, you make it work again.

roar *verb* to make a very loud noise like a lion

robot *noun* a machine that can do some work that a person can do

rock noun a very big piece of stone

rocket *noun* a thing that people travel in to go into space

roundabout *noun* a place where roads all come together and cars drive around

rucksack *noun* a bag that you carry on your back

rules *noun* a list of actions which you must or mustn't do, for example at school or when playing games

S

sardine noun a type of small fish

satellite *noun* something that a country sends into space to help communication, such as mobile phones

sausage *noun* a type of food made of pieces of meat in long, thin skins

save a document *verb* to save the writing you are doing on your computer so you can look at it later

scary *adj* If something is **scary**, it makes you feel afraid or scared.

scientist *noun* a person who studies science for a job

score a goal *verb* in football, to kick the ball into the other team's net

scream verb If you scream, you make a very loud and high sound with your voice because you are excited or scared.

screen noun a thin wall used to show pictures. Computers and TVs have screens made of glass which you look through.

search the Internet *verb* to look for information on the webpages of a computer

secretary *noun* a person whose job is to write letters and organize work for the other people in an office

send a message *verb* to tell someone something in an email or a letter

shadow *noun* a dark shape made behind something when light or sunshine shines in front of it

share *verb* to use something together with another person

shine *verb* (*pt* **shone** *pp* **shone**) When the sun **shines** you can see a bright light in the sky

silly *adj* If someone is **silly**, he or she does something that is not good or is funny.

skeleton *noun* all the bones that are inside a person's or an animal's body

skin *noun* **Skin** covers the outside of a person's or animal's body.

smoothie *noun* a cold drink made from fruit and milk

soft *adj* If something is **soft**, it moves when you touch it and is not hard.

son *noun* a boy or man who is someone's child

sore throat *noun* a bad feeling you have when your throat, which is inside your neck, hurts

spaceship *noun* something that is like a plane that carries people in space

speak verb to say something; to talk

speakers *noun* special boxes for playing music through or for making your voice loud

spellchecker *noun* an action made by the computer to see if your spelling is correct **sponsored** *adj* When a person goes on a **sponsored** bike ride or walk, people called sponsors pay the person. Then he or she gives the money to a charity.

squeeze *noun* when there is not much space

stadium *noun* a big place where people go to watch sport, for example a football match

stage *noun* the place at the front of the theatre where actors perform a play

star *noun* one of the many points of light we can see in the sky at night

stay in touch *verb* to communicate with someone, by telephone, letter or email

steal *verb* (*pt* **stole** *pp* **stolen**) to take something from another person without their permission.

stick *noun* a long, thin piece of wood that you can hold in your hand

stomach ache *noun* a bad feeling you have in the front of your body, in the middle

strawberry *noun* a soft, sweet red fruit

subject *noun* the thing or topic that you are writing or talking about

submarine *noun* a kind of ship that travels under the sea

sugar *noun* a type of food that is used to make things sweet



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
